## WHAT TO WEAR

Please refer to the following dress code guidelines when making decisions about what to wear to school:

- Wear clean clothes in good condition (free of holes or shreds).
- Wear pants at the waist.
- Wear shorts, skirts, or dresses that are at or below the knee.  
\*\*\*With proper undergarment such as: tights, leggings, jeggings and yoga pants, etc., a skirt or dress needs to be fingertip length.
- Tights, leggings, jeggings, and yoga pants are permitted with a long top or sweater. The backside must be covered.
- Wear tops and shirts that cover the midriff, bra straps and shoulders.
- Wear clothing free of words, logos, symbols, trademarks, or other references to alcohol, drugs, sex, violence, profanity, cults, satanism, or death.
- Place coats, hats or other head dresses in lockers upon entering the school.
- Place all book bags in your locker.
- Don't wear pajama pants or cutoffs.
- Don't wear coats, hats, hoods or other head dresses in the school or classrooms.
- Don't wear facial jewelry or piercings. (Clear studs are NOT permitted.)  
✧ *If you think some part of your dress is questionable – don't wear it!*

## ADDITIONAL NOTES ON CLOTHING, HAIRSTYLES, CELL PHONES & MUSIC DEVICES

- Any form of dress or hairstyle which is considered contrary to good hygiene or which is distracting or disruptive to the purpose of education, will not be permitted. Hair that covers one's eyes or unnatural colored hair is prohibited.
- Failure to abide by these rules may result in confiscation and/or disciplinary action, including required clothing change.
- The dress code may be enforced at all school related activities including sporting events and dances.
- Cell phones and music devices (Ipod, MP3, or any other type of music device along with headphones) are not permitted to be visible or turned on in school during the normal school day.
- If a parent needs to contact a student before the end of the school day, he or she should contact the main office.
- Cell phones & music devices used or visible during the school day without express permission from a teacher will be confiscated. Parents may be required to pick up confiscated cell phones.
